THE EPIPHANY CHOIR

COMMUNITY THROUGH SERVICE AND MUSIC

The Epiphany Choir is made up of adults professionals. The choir sings three services a week, including two Sunday morning Eucharist services, as well as Choral Evensong on Sunday. Each member of the choir minimally commits to sing at a weekly Sunday morning service and one Evensong per month. The choir also sings at holiday services throughout the year, performs concerts, and sings in the community. Rehearsals are held on Thursdays from 7:30-9:30 pm from September through May. Most services are live streamed and a weekly Evensong at Epiphany podcast is produced. This past summer, the choir toured in England, spending two weeks in residency at St. Paul's Cathedral, London, and Durham Cathedral.

The Epiphany Choir is a shining example of what is possible with hard work and deep relationships. Its primary role is to support and enhance worship, and it works diligently to make a beautiful offering to God. Epiphany has a deep commitment to being a place for choral and liturgical excellence, and the choir's active ministry is a key part of parish-life.

New members are always welcome to join this active and caring community of singers. Requirements to join the choir are a strong commitment to the choir schedule, a basic knowledge of music, a good ear, and a desire to be a team player. You do not have to be a member of Epiphany or the Episcopal Church to join.

FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY

Saturday, January 6 | 7:30 pm

Celebrate Epiphany's eponymous feast with this festal Eucharist with the Epiphany Choir. A reception will follow the service.

TAIZÉ

Join the Epiphany Choir for a music-filled service of reflection on the Tuesday of Holy Week. This annual Taizé service features chants, readings, prayers, and candle lighting.

TENEBRAE

Wednesday, March 27 | 7:30 pm

Latin for "Darkness," Tenebrae is an ancient service of prayer in which candles are gradually extinguished. The church grows increasingly dim as the congregation meditates on the final hours of Christ's life during Holy Week. The Epiphany Choir chants psalms and sings anthems that help to guide the congregation through the gradual fading of light in this powerful service on Wednesday of Holy Week.

EASTER DAY

Join Epiphany in celebrating the resurrection of Christ. The Epiphany Choir will join with brass to offer joyful hymns and anthems.

CHORAL EVENSONG AT EPIPHANY

Sung every Sunday at 5:30pm September 10, 2023 - May 26, 2024

Epiphany is one of very few churches in the United States where Choral Evensong is sung weekly during the program year, and we hope that you will join us in person each week. Sung at the close of day in cathedrals and churches throughout the world, Choral Evensong is a service of Evening Prayer, derived from the ancient offices of Vespers and Compline. The choir sings the traditional evening prayers of the Church that have been offered for centuries, while the congregation listens, joins in the hymns, and adds their own prayers to those of the choir. It is an opportunity for peaceful meditation in the midst of a busy week.

Evensong is part of the worship which is offered to God by people in every part of the world throughout the day and night. When you come to Evensong at Epiphany, it is as if you were dropping in on a conversation already in progress—a conversation between God and God's people, which began long before you were born and will continue long after you are dead.

Evensong is drawn almost entirely from the Bible. Much of the English of the service is the language spoken and written by our ancestors more than four hundred years ago; it may sound old-fashioned but its meaning is not out of date. It is our hope that your prayers may join with ours in our evening offering of worship.

THE EPIPHANY CHOIR SCHOOL

The Epiphany Choir School is composed of two distinguished ensembles: the Choristers (ages 8 and up) and the Novice Choir (ages 5 to 8). Through training in vocal technique and music reading skills, each child is given the foundation for a lifetime of music making and appreciation.

OUTSTANDING MUSICAL EDUCATION

While we sing as a group, we stress the musical development of each individual musician. Every week, students receive free training in vocal technique and music reading skills, giving each child the foundation for a lifetime of performance and enjoyment of music.

LIFE SKILLS

Beyond musical proficiency, our program instills essential life skills in our choristers. Teamwork, discipline, and respect for others are the cornerstones of a successful choir. By singing and working together, our Choir School students develop leadership skills and learn to value the unique contribution of each singer. These life skills extend far beyond the choir room, benefiting our choristers in various aspects of their lives.

EXCEPTIONAL MUSIC

Our choirs are rooted in the Anglican choral tradition. Students of the Choir School are exposed to a wealth of repertoire spanning a variety of styles, periods, and cultures. On select Sundays throughout the year, Choristers offer music for Mass, both on their own and in combination with Epiphany's semi-professional choir.

EPIPHANY MUSIC ACADEMY SCHOLARSHIPS

Epiphany Choristers and Novices may elect to study piano, or another instrument, through the Epiphany Music Academy. Full scholarships are available for those who demonstrate a need and make a strong commitment to participating in the Choir School.

WHO CAN JOIN?

The Choir School is open to children and youth ages 5 and up who have an eagerness to learn, age-appropriate reading proficiency, and commitment to the choir schedule. All are welcome regardless of musical background and religious affiliation.
