The service is typically held on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day, but is celebrated here after having observed four Sundays of Advent. The nine lessons tell the story of the birth of Jesus: from the fall of Adam, to the prophecies of the Messiah, to the coming of God among us as a baby in a manger. The lessons are interspersed with carols sung by the choir and congregation, culminating in the singing of 'O come, all ye faithful' following the ninth lesson.

May these words and this music propel you toward the true joy of Christmas.



And because this of all things would rejoice his heart, let us at this time remember in his name the poor and the helpless, the hungry and the oppressed; the sick and those who mourn; the lonely and the unloved; the aged and the little children; and all those who know not the Lord Jesus, or who love him not, or who by sin have grieved his heart of love. Lastly, let us remember before God his pure and lowly Mother, and all those who rejoice with us, but upon another shore and in a greater light, that multitude which no one can number, whose hope was in the Word made flesh, and with whom, in this Lord Jesus, we for evermore are one. These prayers and praises let us humbly offer up to the throne of heaven, in the words which Christ himself hath taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

THE FIRST LESSON: Genesis 2:4b-9,15-25

God creates humanity to live in obedience to God in the Garden of Eden.

hese are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created. In the day that the Lord God made the earth and the heavens, when no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up—for the Lord God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no one to till the ground; but a stream would rise from the earth, and water the whole face of the ground—then the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being. And the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there he put the man whom he had formed. Out of the ground the Lord God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food, the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. And the Lord God commanded the man, 'You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die.' Then the Lord God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner.' So out of the ground the Lord God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name. The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner. So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. Then the man said, "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man this one was taken.' Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh. And the man and his wife were both naked, and were not ashamed.





THE NINTH LESSON: John 1: 1-14



St. John unfolds the great mystery of the Incarnation.

n the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

Feast of the Epiphany

Monday | January 6 | 7:30 pm | Church

Every year, 12 days after Christmas, the Epiphany Family gathers for a party. We celebrate the arrival of the Wise Men with a Festive Eucharist. In the Anglican Tradition, this is the official end of Christmastide, but it also has deeper meanings, with its own short season that marks the Baptism of Our Lord and the Wedding of Cana.

Why these events? How are the connected to Christmas? The answer lies in the meaning of the word "epiphany" – it is a moment of sudden revelation or insight, and through these events, we honor the moments in the Jesus story when God made Godself known to God's people. The Feast of the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of God incarnate as Jesus Christ.

This is our eponymous feast as a community, so we follow the Festive Eucharist with a festive party! We ask you to help us make this celebration a success by giving our hospitality team a hand.
