COME AS YOU ARE HOLY EUCHARIST

FEBRUARY 15, 2026 AT 4:30 PM

Dear Epiphany,

This Sunday is a day of joy and promise for our parish. We welcome Bishop Phil LaBelle to Epiphany as we celebrate confirmations, receptions into the Episcopal Church, and the reaffirmation of baptismal vows. These rites are the Church at its best, standing alongside people as they say "yes" to a way of life rooted in Jesus. It is also an opportunity to renew our own "yes" to follow him in the days ahead.

If you haven't met Bishop Phil yet, here's a snapshot. He is the ninth Bishop of the Diocese of Olympia, elected in May 2024 and consecrated in September 2024. Before coming to Western Washington, he served as rector of St. Mark's in Southborough, Massachusetts, where he helped launch interfaith, community-building work like Southborough Neighbors for Peace. His ministry has been shaped by a desire to gather people across differences and tend to the spiritual health of communities.

It is the role of the bishop to visit every church in the diocese at least once every three years. It is likely we won't have the honor of having Bishop Phil with us again until 2029. While he is here today, he will lay hands on our candidates and pray for the Holy Spirit's strengthening gifts. If you are being confirmed, received, or reaffirming your vows, know that your "yes" blesses all of us. And if you are in the pews witnessing these promises, remember that your presence matters. We are not spectators; we are companions. We promise to support one another in continuing in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in persevering in resisting evil, in seeking and serving Christ in all persons, and in respecting the dignity of every human being (BCP 304–305). These aren't abstract ideals; they're the shape of our daily lives.

Please also make a point to join Bishop Phil for the 10:00 am Forum in the Great Hall. Bring your curiosity and your questions. It's a chance to hear his hopes for the Church in Western Washington, to share what you love about Epiphany, and to imagine together how we can be a community that embodies Christ's peace and welcome in Seattle.

The Lord said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction." To the elders he had said, "Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them."

The offertory is a time during the service when we give offerings to God, acknowledging that all we have comes from God. This is our opportunity to offer thanks to God through a monetary gift to support the ministries of Epiphany. Active Epiphany parishioners make an annual pledge commitment toward the vitality of our ministries. In some cases, pledging parishioners also make a financial contribution at the offertory. You may place your offering in the plate, or use the QR code. The collection will be brought up alongside the bread and the wine as we make our offering of "first fruits" to God.

INVITATION TO HOLY COMMUNION

Presider We now turn our attention to the altar, where we first witness, and then share in, the very becoming of God among us: first as bread and wine, then within ourselves through that bread and wine, and finally out into the world through the lives we live.

PRAYER FOR THE MEAL. (Church of Kenya)

During the Eucharistic Prayer, we invite you to participate in the ancient tradition of bowing at certain moments as a sign of reverence. A simple bow of the head is appropriate. During the recitation of the Sanctus ("Holy, holy, holy"), consider a profound bow, lowering the upper half of your body to about a 45-degree angle. These gestures are ways of using our whole bodies in worship, reminding us of the sacredness of the moments we share together in prayer. If you are unsure, feel free to observe others or do what the presider does behind the altar.

Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper



All men at Epiphany are invited to attend (and bring along friends from outside our church family).




